PROTECT YOUR WORKSTATION WITH PLASTIC OR NEWSPAPER FROM THE PASTEL FLAKES.

2.

USE PAPER TOWEL TO CLEAN THE TIP OF YOUR OIL PASTELS WHEN THEY GET DIRTY.

3.

PLACE A SHEET OF PAPER TOWEL BELOW YOUR HAND TO PREVENT YOUR ARTWORK FROM SMUDGING.

4.

WORK DARK TO LIGHT. BACK TO FRONT. THEN BLEND WITH WHITE.

5.

USE BLACK LAST IN YOUR ARTWORK TO KEEP YOUR COLOURS CLEAN.

6.

BLEND ANALOGOUS COLOURS. PLACE COMPLEMENTARY COLOURS NEXT TO EACH OTHER WITHOUT BLENDING.

7.

BRUSH AWAY FLAKES WITH A PAPER TOWEL OR SOFT PAINT BRUSH.




Techniques Oil Pastels

Practice below

Sgraffito

Overlap two thick layers of different colours. Use a toothpick to scratch or scrape away line design revealing the colour underneath.

Scumbling

Apply scribble marks in one colour. Proceed to add another layer of scribbles in a different colour.

Heavy pressure Blending

Lightly add pastels in one direction on paper. Layer another colour to achieve desired hue.

Colour Mixing

Apply a layer of one on the left and another on the right. Blend the two colours in the middle to achieve a new colour.

Light pressure Blending

Lightly add pastels in one direction on paper. Layer another colour to achieve desired hue.

Stippling

Use small dots to create a stippled effect. Layer with additional colours for depth.

Oil

Paint baby oil over your oil pastels to smooth out the marks. Let it dry overnight.

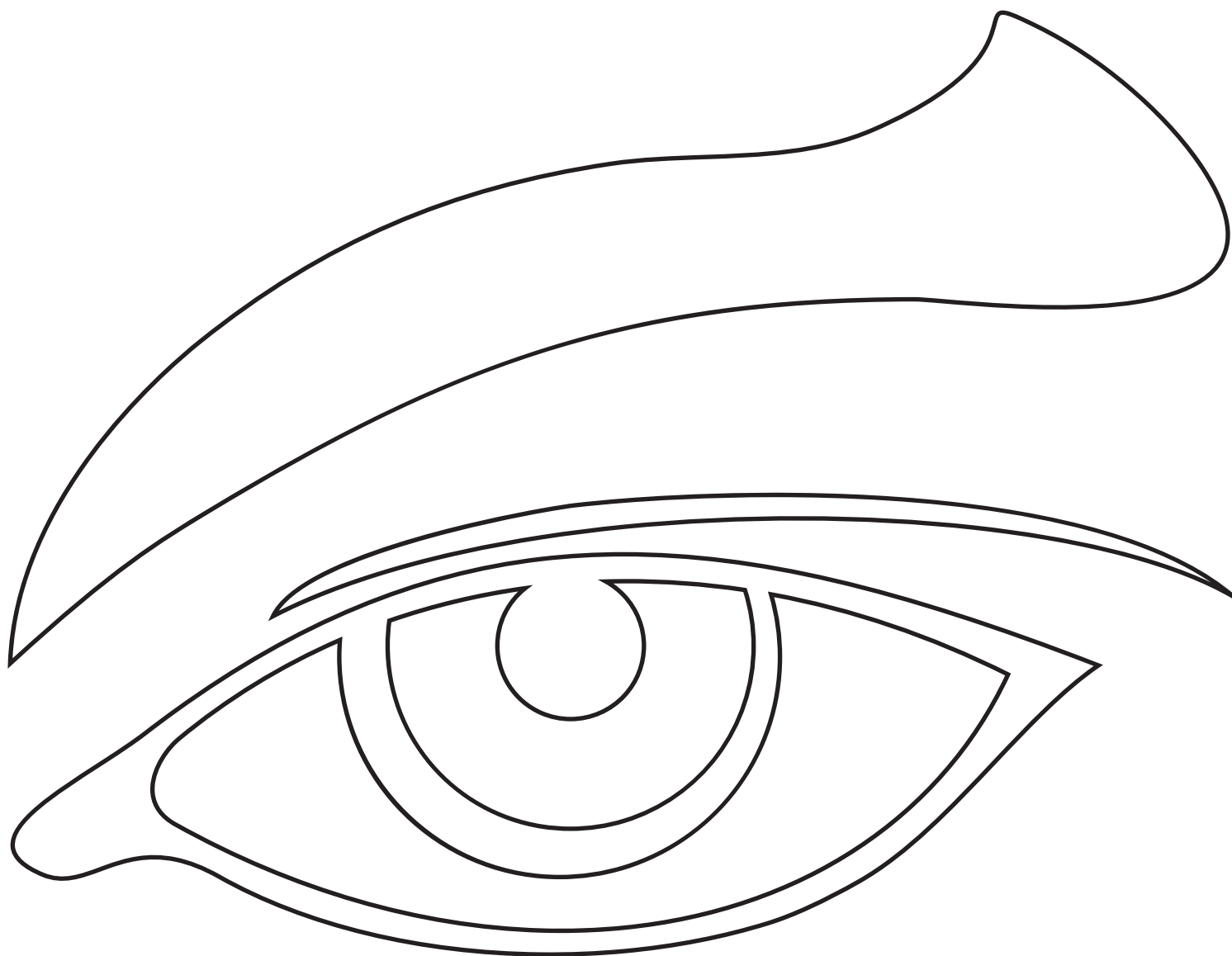
